Incunables" and "block books" and black letter type etc One could give many examples The dictionary covers the major topics and offers a number of helpful definitions There is a lot of material on major players in all the various areas covered but there are many gaps. This dictionary doesn't aim for completeness in 650 articles. It aims to introduce you to the various topics you need to know about and give you sound foundations to build on. There is good cross references at the end of the article and a brief bibliography Some diagrams would have helped but overall this is an impressive achievement This dictionary is not too heavy to curl up in bed with and read at night-- it is full of good things Once you know a bit more consider buying the excellent "Oxford Companion to the Book "The Oxford Companion to the Book This is a two volume work which is excellent-- see the many reviews Summary Feather's Dictionary of Book History covers a broad range of topics in 650 articles in 280.
