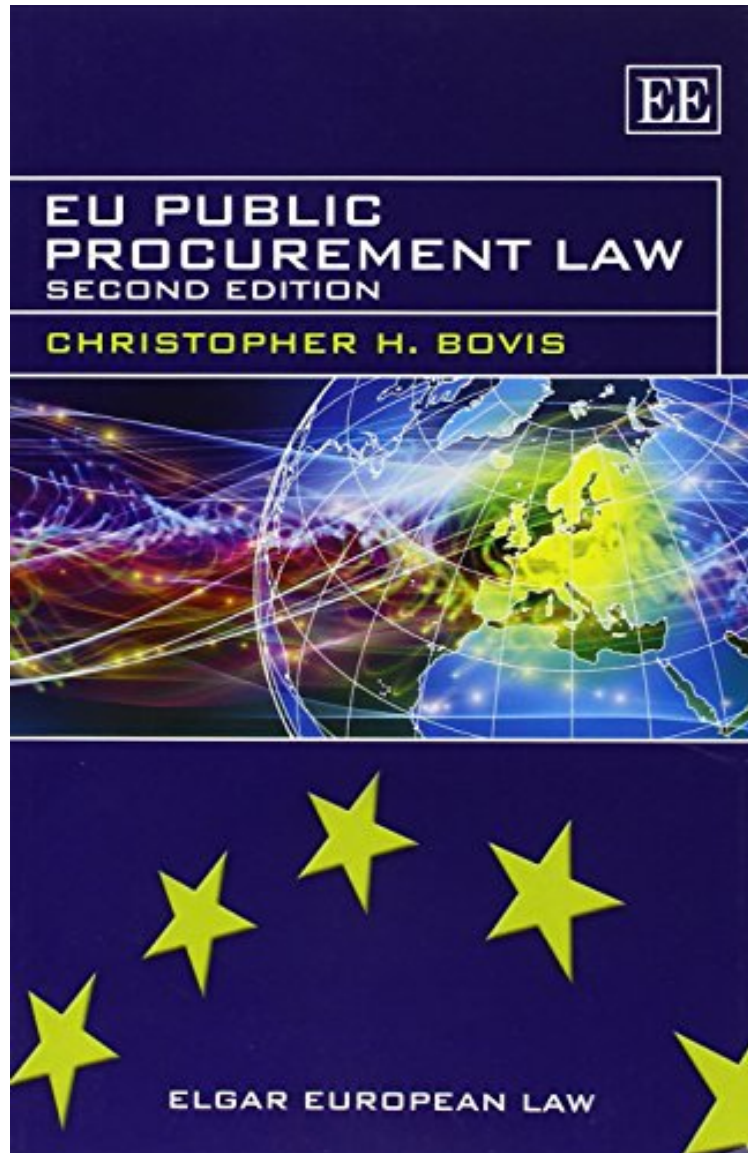

We may be over simplifying the case here, but certainly this well regarded book by Christopher H. Bovis expounds upon it and clarifies it admirably.The title has been recently published by Edward Elgar Publications Limited, and as part of its European Law series, 'EU Public Procurement Law' in the words of the author 'aims to provide the reader with a comprehensive analysis of the law and jurisprudence which have shaped the landscape of the regulation of public procurement in the European Union and its member states.'The purpose of regulating procurement, says the author, is primarily to insert competitiveness into the relevant markets, the aim being to eliminate non-tariff barriers to trade as well as preferential purchasing, which may tend to favour one nation against another. Well regulated procurement practices, on the other hand, encourage -- indeed insist -- on accountability and the avoidance of corruption and undue political influence.Among a host of other issues the author examines the public policy aspects of procurement, including industrial policy and the anti-trust dimension. The regulation of public procurement says the author, is one of the most important drivers for both competitiveness and growth in the EU Member States.Distinguished by its clarity and readability, 'EU Public Procurement Law' puts procurement firmly within a legal context and is an important book for EU practitioners, academics and judges as well as policy-makers and decision-makers not only within the EU, but internationally.Meticulously and extensively footnoted, it contains a useful table of cases before the European Court of Justice, plus -- a detailed index at the back for further ease of use.
