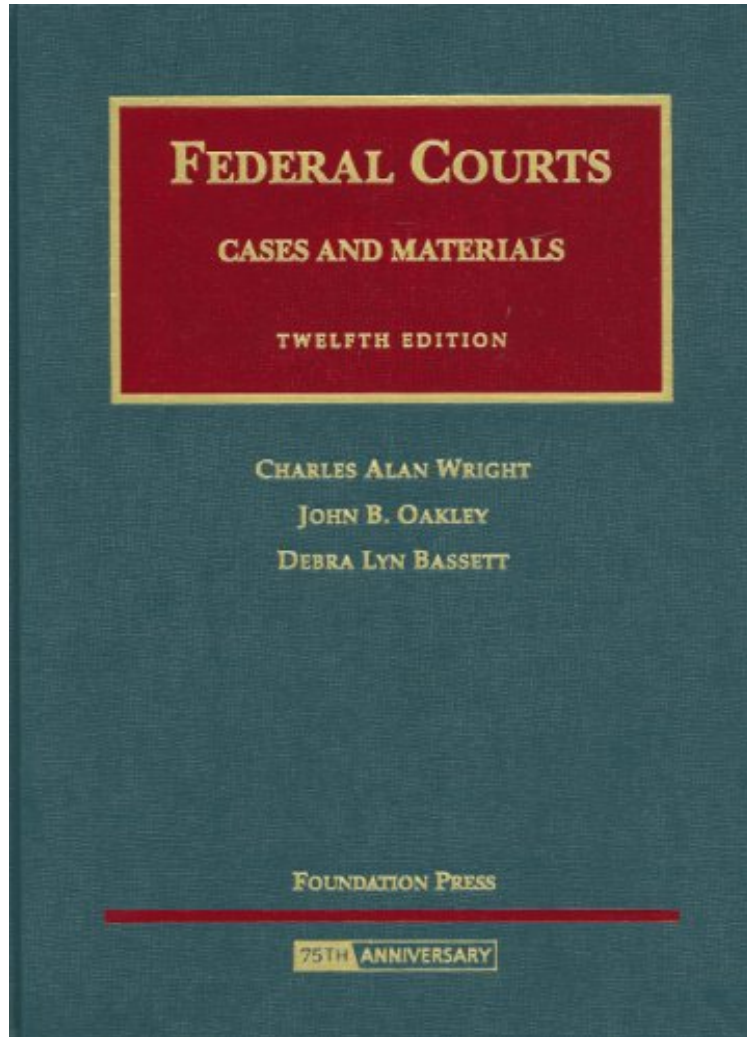

could have put together an equally unimpressive pile of garbage. This is the worst sort of textbook - a loose compilation of edited cases to which the authors add almost zero original thought. The individual chapters have no internal organization; there are no sections, subsections, etc. The authors do not preface any of the material, nor do they provide any coherent, well-written notes after the cases. It would be better for professors to give students a pile of citations rather than force them to spend \$100+ for this "textbook."

The 12th Edition of Wright and Oakley's *Cases and Materials on Federal Courts* retains the style and structure of the 11th Edition, with its distinctive emphasis on cases and annotative footnotes rather than lengthy comments and questions by the editors. It is fully up-to-date, including new principal cases, and fully revised annotations.
